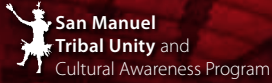

Making the Connection

The 2011 California Native American Day Programs

As we prepare to honor the contributions of tribal nations and peoples during Native American Day in late September, we reflect on the educational value of traditional knowledge as a means of developing a fuller understanding of the ecology, culture and arts that make up Native life ways. This workshop is recommended for teachers that plan to bring their classes to Native American week at Cal State San Bernardino (held the last week of September) and other teachers who wish to learn more about teaching methodologies and content related to the California State Standards focusing specifically on Native American peoples. This year the teacher conference will be held at the San Manuel Indian Reservation Community Center and features specific strategies to help teachers build hands-on experiences into their lessons. Each participant will receive a kit containing supplies and items for students to touch and feel Native American history; the publication, *People of the Pines: A Guide for Grades 3-5 Tribal Unity & Cultural Awareness Program*; and a binder of materials with lesson ideas. These concepts will be expressed for students during a field trip to Cal State San Bernardino the following week, as presenters bring to life the sights and sounds of Native California.
